

- Free or reduced cost facility
- Shared fundraising and/or budget; financial support
- "Built in" visibility (advertising)

The Organizational Setup:


Advantages of partnering with another organization: church, rescue mission, etc.:

Possible readily available spaces:

- Client greeting/waiting room
- Office equipment, files
- Separate rooms for confidential client meetings
- Support of church/organization's leadership
- Help with recruiting volunteers
- Donation of staff assistance












Full representation, including trial court level litigation (not appellate)

 free educational seminars on the types of legal services the organization provides



Clinic Sessions:


Monthly, Bi-weekly;

- Days/times: Saturdays, weekdays, weeknights
- In-person; via phone/zoom



Clinic Session Preparation:


- Appointment-based
- Obtain client intakes in advance by phone, email, or website
- Get client contact info, summary of legal issue, key documents
- Need trained intake coordinator
- Need intake process and forms

Clinic Session Format:


- Attorneys meet with clients in scheduled meetings
- Pros of appointment based: saves time, attorneys are prepared; able to help clients more readily



Clinic Session Format:

Walk-in/help desk style --

- Advertise walk-in clinic open hours
- Attorneys advise on whatever issues come in
- Cons of walk-in: wastes time; attorney unprepared; may not be able to assist a client with a specific legal need (i.e., immigration)






Volunteers Base Needed

- Paralegals



Non-Legal

- Administrative volunteers
- Hospitality volunteers
- Ministry volunteers
- Interpreters
- Communications (e.g., website, newsletters, etc.)
- Event coordinators (e.g., fundraiser dinners, social events)

Volunteer Recruitment and Training:

Volunteer Training

- Formal training sessions on serving clients
- Live sessions by experienced volunteers
- Recorded webinars (available in CLA Resource Library)
- On the job training
- Informational meeting for volunteers to share best practices with each other






Volunteer Recruitment and Training:

Formal CLE training on legal issues

- By attorneys experienced in specific legal issues (either volunteer from within the program or recruited from outside)
- Partner with secular legal aid programs
- Recorded Webinars
- Online Training (e.g., Practicing Law Institute with free webinars)


Liability Insurance

- Directors and Offices (D & O) optional
- Errors and Omissions (E & O) optional
- General Liability (usually carried by host facility and/or organization)



Advertisement and Communications

- Website; email; text
- Churches
- Ministries to the poor (e.g., shelters, food pantries, clothing ministries)
- Social service agencies
- Community charity databases
- Post flyers
- Law firms and local bar associations

Ministry Aspects:

Require a Statement of Faith:

- PROS: clearly explains Christian foundation of the clinic and its workers
- CONS:
 some people may object to the Christian
 emphasis instead of a "secular" one



Ministry Aspects:

Who would have to agree to a Statement of Faith?

- Organization's board and leaders only; Only attorneys; everyone?
- Attorneys encouraged to pray, give spiritual advice, and/or share the Gospel?
- ABA Model Rules re: advice, diligence, Rule 2.1

Ministry Aspects:

Counselor

In representing a client, a lawyer shall exercise independent professional judgment and render candid advice. In rendering advice, a lawyer may refer not only to law but to other considerations such as moral, economic, social and political factors, that may be relevant to the client's situation.



Ministry Aspects:

- Volunteers to pray, give spiritual advice, and share the Gospel
- Referrals to churches and other ministries (social work)
