

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

















A Historical Hub

The city's eighteenth-century Spanish Colonial missions—San Antonio de Valero (the Alamo), Concepción, San José, San Juan, and Espada—have been designated as a United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) World Heritage Site. Together, these five missions represent the largest collection of Spanish Colonial missions in the United States. Honoring the memory of the battles fought at the Alamo and San Jacinto, Fiesta San Antonio has remained the city's signature event since the late 19th century. For eleven days every April, the city gathers to celebrate the history, arts, and cuisine essential to its heritage. In 2018, San Antonio celebrated its Tricentennial with a yearlong calendar of events, activities, and innovative initiatives. This once-in-a-lifetime experience honored the city's people, heritage, and future, and launched the Alamo City into the next three hundred years. National Geographic also got in on the action by naming the city to its "Best of the World" list, calling it a must-see destination.







Art lives everywhere: at picturesque galleries in La Villita and street festivals in Southtown, hidden under bridges on the River Walk, and stretching across building facades in colorful murals. Even historic neighborhoods such as King William and Monte Vista showcase walkable galleries



San Antonio's burgeoning performing arts scene, championed by the **Tobin Center for the Performing Arts** and the Majestic and Empire Theatres, offers a full calendar of dance, opera, theater, live comedy, and celebrated international, national, and local musical acts. The Institute of Texan Cultures and the San Antonio African American Community Archive and Museum are great places for visitors to learn more about the impact of all the people and cultures that have shaped the city.

On the banks of the River Walk, the state-ofthe-art Tobin Center for the Performing Arts features world-class dance, musical. and theatrical performances. Resident companies include Ballet San Antonio, AtticRep Theater Company, Opera San Antonio, Youth Orchestra San Antonio, the Classical Music Institute, Children's Chorus, and Chamber Orchestra. Even locals line up early for shows at the Majestic Theatre, where the Spanish Mediterranean-style venue is as stunning as the performances. Built in 1929, this National Historic Landmark is home to the Broadway in San Antonio series. Beautifully restored to its original 1914 splendor, the gold-clad Charline McCombs Empire Theatre transports guests to the golden age of Hollywood, when icons including Charlie Chaplin and Lou Chaney promoted their new films at this former vaudeville house-turnedmotion-picture theater. Reflecting the city's Mexican heritage, the **Aztec Theatre** hosts

a variety of concerts, films, and other events in a Mesoamerican architectural work of art. In the historic Westside, the Guadalupe Cultural Arts Center is the city's home for Latino, Chicano, and Native American performing arts and entertainment. The GCAC's professional resident program the Guadalupe Dance Company specializes in Mexican folklórico and flamenco dance styles, and the Galería Guadalupe showcases art exhibitions emphasizing local and regional artists. And to the east, in the Dignowity Hill Historic District, the Carver Community Cultural Center celebrates its African and African American heritage with music, theater, spoken word, and dance. Other great places to see concerts and special events include the AT&T Center, the 64.000-seat **Alamodome**, and the 2.300-seat Lila Cockrell Theatre, tucked inside the Henry B. González Convention Center, where traditional performing arts as well as multi-media events are staged.

With its mild climate, greenbelts, waterways, and easy access to the famous Texas Hill Country, San Antonio offers a multitude of recreational activities for outdoor enthusiasts, people with active lifestyles, and sports fans.

or rugged and interactive, like the 65-plus miles of hike and bike trails of the Howard W. Peak Greenway Trails System, San Antonio's parks will get your heart beating. With more than 300 days of sunshine annually, San Antonians play a lot of golf, and with more than 50 local courses and nearly as many within an hour's drive, Alamo City golfers can continuously challenge their games. Try Alamo City Golf Trail, Canyon Springs Golf Club, The Club at Sonterra, and The Quarry Golf Course. Ride the life-giving waters of the San Antonio River on a colorful river barge or kayak or paddle board. Or explore the River Walk's 15-mile path by foot or bike through urban landscapes, riparian ecosystems, and parks. The beautiful 300-plus-acre Brackenridge Park offers visitors a full day of activities, from the Japanese Tea Garden and San Antonio Zoo, to the beloved Brackenridge Park Golf Course, designed in

1916 and designated as a top twenty golf course in Texas by Golfweek. Nearby is Kiddie







What's New in San Antonio

San Antonio marked its Tricentennial—that's 300 years of history!—just last year, and the city is *still* celebrating. We welcome more than thirty-seven million visitors annually to explore some of the newest offerings in and around town. Here's what else is new (and coming soon!) to San Antonio.

FAMILY FUN

The San Antonio Zoo's new rhino habitat, which features a viewing deck, as well as a waterfall with a creek and a mud wallow for the animals, is set to open in 2019. A special breeding program of south white rhinoceroses will begin later this year.

Home to the 1968 World's Fair, the popular Hemisfair downtown park is undergoing a three-phase renovation. Yanaguana Garden, the first phase of the project, is now open daily to the public, and features a four-acre play environment designed for all ages, including a splash pad, a sand play

area, climbing structures, swings and spinners, and several eateries, including Dough Pizzeria Napoletana, Commonwealth Coffeehouse & Bakery, Con Safos Cocina y Cantina, Chocolazzo, and Paleteria San Antonio.



SEA LIFE Aquarium and **LEGOLAND Discovery Center** are new to **The Shops at** Rivercenter, SEA LIFE features a tropical ocean tank with a walkthrough underwater tunnel, and LEGOLAND Discovery Center is the ultimate indoor LEGO® playground for families with children ages three to ten, featuring interactive rides, a 4-D cinema, and the popular MINILAND exhibit with San Antonio landmarks made of LEGO® bricks.

MAY 2019

Armed Forces River Parade

Dedicated to the Armed Forces, decorated floats travel down the River Walk.

Cinco De Mayo

Celebrations to commemorate the Mexican Army's victory over the French Empire in 1862 include a festival with music and food at historic Market Square.

Culinaria: A Wine and Culinary Arts Festival

Culinaria celebrates San Antonio as a premier wine and food destination and an important gateway to Mexico and Latin America.

Fiesta Noche del Rio

Performances on Friday and Saturday evenings feature songs and dances of Mexico, Spain, and Argentina at the River Walk's historic Arneson River Theatre.

Tejano Conjunto Festival

The oldest conjunto festival in the U.S. happens in Rosedale Park and features more than 30 of the best bands in this lively genre. Jamming accordians and the strings of bajo sextos make a style reminiscent of European polka music.

San Antonio Summer Art & Jazz Festival

The "SAS Fest" is a free, three-day event featuring an outstanding lineup of local and nationally known jazz artists, an arts-and-crafts fair, and local foods.

River Walk

The iconic River Walk provides a feast for the eyes and palate, and everyone hungers for that perfect outdoor table with a view. On the River Walk, towering cypress trees, stone bridges arching over the gentle river, and neon reflections on a mariachi's glossy guitarrón are all on the menu.

The tri-level, ultra-modern **Ácenar** is not your average Tex-Mex joint. Among the favorites of the Nuevo Tex-Mex menu are short-rib tacos, house-smoked salmon nachos, and tableside guacamole. Celebrating 20 years, Biga on the Banks sets the standard for fine dining on the River Walk. Chef Bruce Auden created a menu that mixes European, Tex-Mex, American, and Asian-influenced dishes in an industrial-chic atmosphere. Boudro's Texas Bistro embraces the regional flavors for which Texas and the Southwest have come to be known. Start with tableside-prepared guacamole before sliding into an order of pecan-grilled lamb chops with peach chutney, and wash it all down with a prickly-pear margarita. Locals and visitors alike gather on the spacious patio of Paesanos Riverwalk for authentic Italian cuisine al fresco. In the mood for seafood? Bubba Gump Shrimp Co., Joe's Crab Shack, and Landry's Seafood House are steps away. And for a romantic meal on the River Walk, Ostra is known for its exquisite seafood, including its acclaimed Oyster Bar.

"Iron Chef Gauntlet" contestant and chef Jason Dady opened Range to showcase the bounty of the Texas Hill Country. Nearly all of the eatery's meat is sourced from Texas-based 44 Farms, from the house dry-aged New York strip, to the bone-in ribeye, tomahawk chop,



Pearl

San Antonio's hip epicenter of culinary and cultural delights is the historic Pearl Brewery Complex. This mixed-use space of stunning late-nineteenth century architecture, energyconscious structures, and lively green spaces is home to some of the city's most innovative new restaurants.

Housed in one of Pearl's

three original structures, **Boiler House Texas Grill** & Wine Garden welcomes guests to dine on gourmet Texas Hill Country fare beside the three enormous boilers that powered the historic brewery. What happens when you cross the cuisines of Peru and Asia? Peruvian-Asian fusion restaurant **Botika** has the answer: plantain sushi rolls, ceviche served with wonton chips, and a bar stocked with sake, pisco, and cachaca. As you walk into Cured, the brewery's former administration building, a large charcuterie case clues you into to what to expect on the menu: meat-centric selections featuring housecured charcuterie plates, chicken-fried chicken livers. and veal osso busco. Named after the old Pearl Brewery's bottling department it sits on, the upscale **Bottling** Department Food Hall offers a variety of dining options. From short-rib

For a unique dining experience there's Savor, The Culinary Institute of American restaurant and bar where guests build multicourses prepared by advanced culinary students for an adventurous meal. At Chef Jeff Balfour's Southerleigh Fine Food & Brewery, southern cuisine meets his Galveston upbringing: oysters, crab, grilled redfish, and Gulf shrimp pair well with Southerleigh drafts.

Southtown

Just south of downtown is Southtown. a hip, artistic hub for galleries, shopping, nightlife and, of course, dining.

Many people flock to S. Alamo Street in search of the city's best Tex-Mex. When the street corner lights up neon pink, you'll know you've found Rosario's. Consistently honored by critics as the best in San Antonio, Rosario's offers a contemporary twist on traditional south-of-the-border dishes like fish tacos, ceviche, and specialty margaritas.

Much like the eclectic architecture of Southtown's King William neighborhood, this dining district's cuisine showcases a variety of cultural influences. Restaurateur and chef team Andrew Goodman and Stefan Bowers invite guests to Battalion to dine on Southern Italian classics like veal parmesan and shrimp scampi in an historic 1924 firehouse, which features brick archways and a fire pole. Their sister establishment, Feast, offers tapasstyle New American cuisine with Mediterranean flair. Miami-chic decor and a lively see-and-be-seen patio make Feast the place for (continued p. 52)



TACO TOWN

Whether your fillings are nestled into a fried corn tortilla, wrapped in a soft flour one, or presented in any other trendy form imaginable, tacos are always on the menu.

Breakfast Tacos

Everything tastes better wrapped in a homemade corn or flour tortilla, especially breakfast ingredients. Start your day off right with a chorizo and papas breakfast taco from Pete's Tako House or a chilaquiles taco from Taco Taco Cafe.

Fajita

For the best sizzling fajitas—grilled meat and vegetables served with a tortilla and help-yourself sides—order the combination chicken, beef, and shrimp at Alamo Cafe.

Cabrito

The roasted veal of the goat world. For the best in town, head to Los Barrios for the Cabrito en Salsa.

The great debate continues! Why not have both? Find some of the best corn tortillas at Los Compadres Mexican Grill. If you're a fan of flour, head to El Milagrito Cafe.

Brisket

Cooked for hours to reach tender perfection, brisket remains the standard by which all barbecue joints are judged. Start and end your search at the selfproclaimed "Home of the Barbecue Brisket Taco," Garcia's Mexican Food.

Barbacoa

The Caribbean cooking style from which the term "barbecue" originated, barbacoa refers to fatty and flavorful slow-cooked beef. Typically available only on weekends, find your fix seven days a week at El Milagrito.

Carne Asada

Marinated in traditional spices and seared for fire-grilled char flavor, these beef steaks are thinly sliced into mouth-watering strips. Try the six mini tacos stuffed with grilled flank steak, chopped onions, and shredded cilantro at Fajita Taco Place.

Nopal con Chile

Cactus strips doused in a smoky ancho adobo sauce are found in these tacos at La Bandera Molino.

Puffy Tacos

Fillings folded into a pillow of fried, puffy masa, these tacos are a force to be reckoned with in the Alamo City. Order the old-school picadillo version (seasoned ground beef) taco at Ray's Drive Inn or a shredded chicken puffy taco at Henry's Puffy Taco Cantina.





brunch in San Antonio. With Instagram-ready ambiance and a stocked tiki bar, Hot Joy fires up small plates of spicy Asian food and fish bowls of tropical rum cocktails. At **The** Maverick Texas Brasserie, French charm and Texas ingredients go hand-in-hand. Chefs cook seafood, steaks and poultry-even a whole roast duck-over the coals of a wood-burning stove. At Guenther House, enjoy plate-sized cinnamon rolls, fluffy biscuits, and gooey apple strudels in the beautifully-restored 1860 home of the Pioneer Mills founder, or dine under the stars or in an elegantly redesigned gas station at Bliss. Featuring an impressive wine list and appetizer selection—be sure to try the oyster sliders, served with candied bacon on buttermilk-chive biscuits—Bliss will surely bring you to culinary ecstasy.

Home to many of the city's best contemporary art galleries, the Blue Star Arts Complex also hosts a variety of creative restaurants. Tucked behind the old grain silos near the complex are two new restaurants from chef Johnny Hernandez. Laid-back burger joint Burgerteca adds a Mexican twist to the all-American classic. A house favorite is the El Pastor: a guajillo- and ancho chile-seasoned patty topped with grilled pineapple, manchego cheese, and cilantro. Don't forget to check out Hernandez's original Southtown establishment The Frutería. Serving fresh fruit cups, smoothies, and tostadas by day, this vibrant,

colorful cantina transforms into a swanky hotspot serving Mexican tapas and fruitinfused cocktails by sundown.

Near Downtown

Many longtime favorites live with the locals in nearby Government Hill, Alamo Heights, Monte Vista and Olmos Park. Across from Pearl, chef Jason Dady's Shuck Shack serves highquality oysters, shrimp, and lobster rolls in a rustic-chic atmosphere. In Alamo Heights, Cappy's Restaurant has served upscale food in a laid-back setting for more than 20 years. Or try its sister Cappyccino's nextdoor, a bistro and bar with tasty burgers, pizza, soups and salads. In Monte Vista, enjoy a michelada under the trees on the beautiful outdoor patio of La Fonda on Main, where classic Tex-Mex fare and margaritas have been a mainstay since 1932. In neighboring Olmos Park, chefs at the 12-seat Mixtli create ten-course regional Mexican tasting menus using ancient cooking techniques.

In north San Antonio's The Alley on Bitters, friends share a yoga class and then a table at the **NEW!** Meadow Neighborhood Eatery + Bar. Enjoy seasonal Southern and American eats at husbandand-wife duo John and Elise Russ' new restaurant. Clementine.



Take a step back in time and explore the lives of early Spanish settlers who founded what would become San Antonio. Five historic missions still remain on the banks of the San Antonio River and form a UNESCO World Heritage Site.


Begin your historic journey at the **Alamo**, which was first established as Mission San Antonio de Valero in 1718. By 1793, it became a military outpost, cementing its role as a central locale in Texas' journey to independence. More than 2.5 million people

> visit the Alamo every year, making it the most visited attraction in the Lone Star State.

Mission Concepción is home to the best-preserved Spanish colonial structure in the United States. Gaze at the fading geometric designs still visible on the church's exterior: the facade has remarkably stood the test of era. Inside, vibrant frescoes showcase the stunning artwork typical of the time.

The largest structure, Mission San José, is known as the "Queen of the Missions." Its striking rose window and façade are lavish examples of Spanish colonial ornamentation, Mission San José is also home to a visitor's center

and is the departure point for free, park ranger-guided tours.

At Mission Espada, the southernmost mission, take in the colonial-style irrigation system, the compound's blacksmith shop, and the working kiln and spinning wheels for a glimpse into Native American and Spanish settlers' agrarian ways of life.

A prime example of a self-sustaining community, Mission San Juan was known for its fertile farmlands and abundant crops.

One of the 15-mile San Antonio River Walk's three sections, Mission Reach extends south of downtown connecting the River Walk to four of the five missions through an eight-mile riparian woodland ecosystem featuring smooth walking and biking paths punctuated by public art.







The Witte Museum The Witte Museum is devoted to science and natural history, with children's exhibits, traveling exhibits, and a renowned early Texas art collection. The Witte Museum debuted its \$100 million, once-ina-century transformation, bringing more than 170,000 square feet of renovated and expanded exhibition space offering the Naylor Family Dinosaur Gallery, the H-E-B Body Adventure, and The South Texas Heritage Center, among other historic and cultural attractions on its tenacre, garden-laden campus.

The McNay Art Museum

Texas' first modern art museum, the McNay Art Museum houses a pristine assortment of more than 200,000 works of modern art, stemming from its namesake Marion Koogler McNay's 700-piece collection. The

museum is known for its Medieval and Renaissance art and 19th-through 21st-century European and American collections.

The Briscoe Western Art Museum

Capturing the new spirit of the West, this three-story museum houses artifacts. paintings, sculptures, and more, which tell the rich history of the American West.

San Antonio Museum of Art

Housed in the historic Lone Star Brewery, the San Antonio Museum of Art features 30,000 objects spanning 5,000 years of history from around the globe. The museum contains the largest collection of Asian art in the Southern U.S.. as well as one of the most comprehensive collections of Latin American Art.

Institute of Texan Cultures Located near the Tower of

Three Days in the City

DAY 1

Step Into the Old World

Plan your tour of the five 18th-century Spanish Colonial missions over coffee at Ocho at Hotel Havana. About a mile from the stone steps of the Alamo, the River Walk's expanded Mission Reach will lead you to Missions Concepción (check out the gorgeous frescoes), San José (don't miss the mysterious rose window!), San Juan, and Espada. Then, take a self-guided walking tour through the King William neighborhood's Greek Revival, Victorian, and Italianate homes before visiting the Steves Homestead Museum and Villa Finale. Grab a beer at **B&D Ice House** or a cocktail at **The Cherrity Bar**. End the night in the city's Main Plaza, where a dazzling artistic display lights up the San Fernando Cathedral four nights a week with San Antonio | The Saga. The free show combines music and video to tell the story of the city's early days in 24 minutes of breathtaking art.

DAY 2

Discover Museums

Take a deep dive into the culture and arts of San Antonio with a museum crawl. Western buffs and Texas naturalists alike gravitate to the Briscoe Western Art Museum and The Witte Museum, or visit the San Antonio Museum of Art and its treasure trove of Asian, European, Islamic, Latin American, American, and Texan art. Enjoy lunch on the outdoor terrace of the museum overlooking the River Walk at chef Jason Dady's Tre **Trattoria**. Then head to the **McNay Art Museum** (the first modern art museum in Texas!), which features paintings, drawings, and sculptures. Recharge with a massage at Mokara Hotel & Spa, or enjoy Hill Country views from The Shops at La Cantera. Later, take in a live performance at the **Majestic Theatre**.

DAY 3

Smell the Roses

Start at **Bakery Lorraine** at **Pearl** (and grab a few macarons for later). On the weekend, stroll the Pearl Farmers Market, and check out some of the area's great retailers. Head to the new San Pedro Creek Culture Park, an outdoor oasis where visitors can go on an invigorating hike or a bike ride along its trails, or just relax and take in the public art. Explore the unique galleries and shops at the Blue Star Arts Complex in Southtown. Or check out the new Ruby City contemporary art center, opening fall 2019. Home to more than 800 paintings, sculptures, and video art by contemporary artists, the crimson-colored building was inspired by a dream of late arts patron Linda Pace. End the day with a romantic dinner at La Villita's Fig Tree or a steak at Little Rhein Steak House.



Located in the cellar of the Bottling Department at the historic Pearl Brewery, the club features blues, Texas swing, salsa and of course, jazz, including regular performances from founder and local bandleader Doc Watkins. Late night revelers dance to the beat at Heat, part of The Strip SA, a vibrant nightlife zone of LGBTQ-friendly bars, restaurants, and dance clubs. Choose from three floors of bassthumping fun at Bonham Exchange. Built in 1891 as a German athletic association. this downtown hotspot offers a variety of musical genres in an inclusive atmosphere. When neon cocktails come in buckets and







If you prefer singing with a pint of Guinness in your hand, stroll down to the riverside at Durty Nelly's Irish Pub, a replica of the original 1620 tavern in Limerick, Clare County. Or stop at swanky rooftop bar Paramour, where guests can choose from 20 specialty hand-crafted cocktails while taking in awesome views of the San Antonio skyline. Not-to-miss San Antonio nightlife favorites include: Bar Rojo at the Grand Hyatt, offering craft cocktails and bar bites; Havana Bar at the Hotel Havana, voted best hotel bar; Merkaba a new cocktail lounge and nightclub where DJs spin when a live band isn't in the house; Pat O'Brien's, a replica of the New Orleans institution, where guests enjoy Cajun fare, Hurricanes and a dueling piano bar; Tex's Sports Bar, where beer, margaritas, and sports mix on the River Walk; or end your night by visiting the city's most haunted bars and hotels as you raise a glass on a Nightly Spirits' Ghost Tour & Pub Crawl.

From internationally-acclaimed acts to culturally-rich, local favorites, San Antonio holds the spotlight on live music and comedy.

For live music and revelry, spend your evening on the St. Mary's Strip at revamped venues Paper Tiger, The Amp Room, The Mix, Limelight, Hi-Tones, or La Botánica. Recent additions capturing the distinctive San Antonio scene are The Squeezebox-a live music and dancing venue that features Tejano, conjunto, and cumbia music in addition to DJ setsand Jandro's—a nightclub that celebrates live music, local art. and the chill factor. The folks at The Rustic know the ingredients for a good time: farm-to-table regional fare, local beer and cocktails, and live music under the stars. And it's no surprise one of the co-founders is country music star and San Antonio native Pat Green. John T.

Floore's Country Store draws big names in country music and big crowds to the small town of Helotes, just northeast of San Antonio. An authentic Texas dancehall and cafe rather than an actual store. Floore's is known to many as the musical birthplace of country music legend Willie Nelson. If Western swing ain't your thing, check out Sam's

Gabriel Iglesias, Anjelah Johnson, Carlos Mencia, Richard Lewis, and Margaret Cho have all held the mic at this comedy venue. Or get involved in the act at Comedysportz. Not your typical improv show, the quick-witted comedians compete for the biggest laughs in teams. Though the BYOB venue allows guests to BYOKids to early shows (adultsonly shows are later), all of the shows are entertaining for all ages.

FREDERICK SBURG

The Texas Hill Country's most popular hub for wine enthusiasts offers antique stores, restaurants, and lively street festivals along charming Main Street. Visit one of the more than 40 wineries and tasting rooms or pack a picnic to Enchanted Rock State Natural Area, featuring a massive pink granite dome rising among the Texas hills.

KINGSVILLE

Just two hours south of San Antonio is Kingsville, the town the King Ranch built. Tour parts of this historic 825,000acre ranch and learn about the King Ranch saga. Check out the 1904 Train Depot Museum and enjoy a treat at Harrel's Pharmacy's old-fashioned soda fountain.

SAN MARCOS

Nearby San Marcos is home to Texas State University, the largest outlet shopping center in the U.S., and a colorful historical district ripe for exploring. Or spend a day on the springfed San Marcos River, whether you tour in a glass-bottom boat, or float, paddle, snorkel, or waterski.

The Queen of Tejano singer Selena Quintanilla spent a lot of time in San Antonio before her tragic death in 1995. Indeed, the Alamo City was like a second home to her-she even had a boutique in town. If you are a fan of the 1997 biopic Selena, starring Jennifer Lopez, you can revisit spots where several key scenes were shot. Follow in Selena's footsteps as you note some of the city's tributes to her.

The "Selena Bridge"

A romantic scene from the movie *Selena* was filmed on an arched stone bridge, located between N. Saint Mary's Street and Navarro Street.

Christopher Montoya's Mural

Self-taught artist's larger than life depiction of the pop-star adorns the wall of a small shopping center.



Market Square

Market Square's plaza can barely contain the lively cultural activity of its restaurants, shops, produce stands, and performers. Bonus points if you can fit papel picado, a mariachi, and a margarita all in one frame.

Selena Etc.

In 1993, the Tejano star opened Selena Etc. boutique and salon, at 3703 Broadway. It closed after her death.

Hard Rock Café

Selena christened the café at its grand opening. Today, there's a star honoring her outside.

The Depot at Historic **Sunset Station**

Served as a backdrop for Selena's music video for, "No Me Mas."

Mi Tierra

Check out the tribute to Selena at Mi Tierra where the singer's brother, A.B. Quintanilla, reportedly loves to sit nearby when he visits.

getting around Town

NAVIGATE THE CITY LIKE A LOCAL.

Much of downtown San Antonio is walkable, and the city offers easily accessible interstates and highways, making getting around a breeze.

VIA VIVA **BUS ROUTES**

VIVA, a new service line from VIA Metropolitan Transit, takes you to the most-visited sites and attractions in the heart of San Antonio. Three distinct VIVA routes—VIVA Culture. VIVA Missions, and VIVA Centro connect riders with historic sites. museums, classic and contemporary art galleries, and popular dining and entertainment spots. VIVA is ideal for getting to the San Antonio Missions World Heritage Site, the Alamo, Market Square, the River Walk, Pearl, and more. You can even take VIVA to San Antonio International Airport.

RENTAL CARS

Car rental counters are located in the lobby of the new Consolidated Car Rental Facility at the airport, accessible by elevator or escalator on the Mezzanine Level in Terminal B and across the Sky Bridge. Got

a lot of passengers? **Elegant** Limousine has a fleet of options, including mini buses and coaches.

PARKING

Pay stations are automated kiosks that accept coins. as well as credit and debit cards, and they provide receipts. Instructions in English and Spanish assist users.



TAXIS

Snag a cab at the airport at the outer commercial curbside at Terminal A. The fare to downtown San Antonio runs approximately \$24-\$29 per cab. To order a taxi for other journeys, you can call or make online reservations. Or if you have a smartphone, catching a ride is easy with the Hail A Cab San Antonio app or Yellow Cab's zTrip app.

SCOOTERS

Electric scooters—Bird. Blue Duck. Lime, and others—arrived on the streets of San Antonio in June 2018. Riders must be at least 16 vears old, and the use of helmets is encouraged. Most scooters can be unlocked with a smart-phone app and vary in cost to ride.

GO RIO RIVER **CRUISES**




SHUTTLES


